It may authorize a third party to initiate electronic did transfers between your account and the third ty's account. These transfers to make or receive rement may be one-time occurrences or may recur as acted by you. These transfers may use the tomated Clearing House (ACH) or other payments work. Your authorization to the third party to make se transfers can occur in a number of ways. For ample, your authorization to convert a check to an actronic fund transfer or to electronically pay a surned check charge can occur when a merchant evides you with notice and you go forward with the insaction (typically, at the point of purchase, a rechant will post a sign and print the notice on a eipt). In all cases, these third party transfers will uire you to provide the third party with your account mber and financial institution information. This ormation can be found on your check as well as on a posit or withdrawal slip. ## **UNAUTHORIZED TRANSFERS**

(a) Consumer Liability. Tell us at once if you believe your card and/or code has been lost or stolen, or if you believe that an electronic fund transfer has been made without your permission using information from your check. Telephoning is the best way of keeping your possible losses down. You could lose all the money in your account (plus your maximum overdraft line of credit). If you tell us within 2 business days after you learn of the loss or theft of your card and/or code, you can lose no more than \$50 if someone used your card and/or code without your permission. Also, if you do NOT tell us within 2 business days after you learn of the loss or theft of your card and/or code, and we can prove we could have stopped someone from using your card and/or code without your permission if you had told us, you could lose as much as \$500. Also, if your statement shows transfers that you did not make, including those made by card, code or other means, tell us at once. If you do not tell us within 60 days after the statement was mailed to you, you may not get back any money you lost after the 60 days if we can prove that we could have stopped someone from taking the money if you had told us in time.

If a good reason (such as a long trip or a hospital stay) kept you from telling us, we will extend the time period.

☑ Visa<sup>®</sup> Debit Card. Additional Limits on Liability for VISA Debit Card

Unless you have been negligent or have engaged in fraud, you will not be liable for any unauthorized transactions using your lost or stolen Visa card. This additional limit on liability does not apply to ATM transactions outside of the U.S., to ATM transactions not sent over Visa or Plus networks, or to transactions using your Personal Identification Number which are not processed by Visa. (b) Contact in event of unauthorized transfer. If you believe your card and/or code has been lost or stolen, call or write us at the telephone number or address listed at the end of this disclosure. You should also call the number or write to the address listed at the end of this disclosure if you believe a transfer has been made using the information from your check without your permission.

## **ERROR RESOLUTION NOTICE**

In Case of Errors or Questions About Your Electronic Transfers, Call or Write us at the telephone number or address listed below, as soon as you can, if you think your statement or receipt is wrong or if you need more information about a transfer listed on the statement or receipt. We must hear from you no later than 60 days after we sent the FIRST statement on which the problem or error appeared.

- (1) Tell us your name and account number (if any).
- (2) Describe the error or the transfer you are unsure about, and explain as clearly as you can why you believe it is an error or why you need more information.
- (3) Tell us the dollar amount of the suspected error.

If you tell us orally, we may require that you send us your complaint or question in writing within 10 business days.

We will determine whether an error occurred within 10 business days (5 business days if involving a Visa® point-of-sale transaction processed by Visa or 20 business days if the transfer involved a new account) after we hear from you and will correct any error promptly. If we need more time, however, we may take up to 45 days (90 days if the transfer involved a new account, a point-of-sale transaction, or a foreign-initiated transfer) to investigate your complaint or question. If we decide to do this, we will credit your account within 10 business days (5 business days if involving a Visa point-of-sale transaction processed by Visa or 20 business days if the transfer involved a new account) for the amount you think is in error, so that you will have the use of the money during the time it takes us to complete our investigation. If we ask you to put your complaint or question in writing and we do not receive it within 10 business days, we may not credit your account. An account is considered a new account for 30 days after the first deposit is made, if you are a new customer.

We will tell you the results within three business days after completing our investigation. If we decide that there was no error, we will send you a written explanation.

You may ask for copies of the documents that we used in our investigation.

## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

CROSS BORDER FEE:

For cards with VISA and/or PLUS logos: A 1% Currency Conversion Fee will be assessed on International transactions where VISA or PLUS has performed a currency conversion function.

This fee will be based on a rate selected by VISA/PLUS from the range of rates available in wholesale currency markets for the applicable central processing date, which rate may vary from the rate VISA/PLUS itself receives, or the government mandated rate in effect for the applicable central processing date.

A .80% (80 basis points) Cross Border Fee will be assessed on all single currency international transactions.

For cards with Cirrus and/or Maestro logos: A .20% (20 basis points) Currency Conversion Fee will be assessed on International transactions where Cirrus or Maestro has performed a currency conversion function.

This fee will be based on either a government mandated exchange rate, or a wholesale exchange rate selected by Cirrus or Maestro and the rate used will be the applicable rate on the day the transaction was processed, which may differ from the date of the transaction or when it posted to the cardholder's account.

A.90% (90 basis points) Cross Border Fee will be assessed on all International transactions whether or not a currency conversion function was performed by Cirrus or Maestro.

OTHER FEES:

There is a \$6.75 fee per replacement ATM or VISA Check Card and per replacement PIN code.

Transaction maximum is \$750.00

BUSINESS VISA EXCEPTIONS:

Business VISA Card limits are \$2,500 when used as a credit card, \$1,510 when used as a Debit with a PIN, \$1,510 when used at an ATM. Daily maximum is \$2,500.
